General Areas of Service:

This degree should be considered as a preparation for further study in one of a variety of disciplines. For example, programs can be planned to meet the requirements for Pre-Medicine or Pre-Dentistry (see curriculum guide sheet Major in Music--B.S. with Pre-Medical and Pre-Dental requirements) or graduate studies in music or other fields. It is anticipated that most graduates will continue education toward specialized, professional careers. One can teach in a private music studio with this degree.

Professional Training:

Most graduates with this degree will want to pursue graduate study in some area before seeking employment.

Denominational Opportunities:

Except for unusual cases, employment with only this degree is not to be expected.

Job Outlook:

Not applicable except for private studio teachers who can set up a successful studio in most communities.

Earnings:

Not applicable except for private studio instruction: \$30 to \$100+ an hour.
