

**ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

FOR BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN MANAGEMENT**

All transfer students who wish to receive the degree Bachelor of Science in Management from Pacific Union College's Degree Completion Program must satisfy the coursework included in the General Education Curriculum (GEC). Students in the Degree Completion Program will earn 61 quarter-units of credit, applicable to the total 192 units that are required for a bachelor's degree.
