Program Structure and Requirements

The California SB2042 Preliminary Multiple Subject Teaching Credential can be earned as part of the undergraduate program, as a post-baccalaureate non-degree program, or as a Master of Arts in Teaching (M.A.T.) program. Students may also earn the SDA Basic Elementary certificate while completing the M.A.T. Students should consult with the credential analyst to determine the appropriate program for their needs.

This guidesheet describes the M.A.T. program, which results in a teacher certification as well as a degree. Students interested in the undergraduate program or the post-baccalaureate nondegree program should refer to page EDUC-04.

Prerequisites for Admission

Candidates must be formally admitted to the program before they will be admitted to methods courses or field experiences.

> Prerequisites for all applicants

- 1. Complete EDUC 101 Introduction to Teaching and EDUC 101L Classroom Observations.
- 2. Meet Basic Skills by:
 - a) Coursework
 - b) Coursework and Exam
 - c) Achieving Qualifying Score on the SAT or ACT
 - d) Pass the CBEST
 - c) Pass the CSET: Multiple Subjects Plus Writing Skills Examination

e) Pass the CSU Early Assessment Program or the CSU Placement Examinations

- f) College Board Advanced Placement (AP) Examinations
- g) Pass a Basic Skills Examination from Another State
- 3. Subject Matter Competency met by:

a) Completion of coursework, as verified by a Commission-approved program of professional preparations that addresses each of the commission-adopted domains of the applicable subject matter requirements.

b) Successful completion of an academic major in the subject you will teach (SS Ed Code 44257(a) & MS Liberal Studied Ed Code 44282)

c) Pass the California Subject Exam for Teachers (CSET) in the subject you will teach.

- 4. Obtain a Certificate of Clearance from the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing to verify criminal record clearance.
- 5. Submit official documentation demonstrating completion of a four-year bachelor's degree from a regionally-accredited institution of higher education.
- 6. Demonstrate a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0.
- 7. Submit the complete program application as follows:
 - a) Application form
 - b) Advisor Interview
 - c) Personal Statement
 - d) Recommendation
 - e) Official transcripts for all college work
 - f) Basic Skills verification
 - g) Certificate of Clearance (criminal record check)
 - h) Verification of Subject Matter Competency
 - i) SDA church membership verification (if a SDA member)

8. Complete the admissions interview with the Credential Analyst.

Requirements for Graduation with the M.A.T.

To receive the M.A.T. with the Multiple-Subject specialization, students must meet the following requirements:

- 1. Complete the program coursework (55 credits) for the M.A.T. All courses must be completed at the graduate level. Exception: One undergraduate course may be transferred in to the Basic Core section.
- 2. Demonstrate a minimum overall graduate GPA of 3.0 with no grade lower than B-.
- 3. Successfully submit and present the California Teaching Performance Expectations (TPEs) portfolio to the faculty and other educators.

Requirements for the Teaching Credential

To be recommended for the California SB2042 Preliminary Multiple Subject Teaching Credential, candidates must hold a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution, and have completed satisfactorily all the course work, field work, and examinations as listed.

Requirements for SDA Certification

To be recommended for the SDA Basic Elementary certificate, candidates must complete the following additional requirements:

EDUC 568+L K-12 Bible & Practicum

18 hours of religion coursework, including RELT 205 or 220, RELH 360, and 3 hours of RELB coursework

These SDA requirements are not part of the M.A.T. degree, but may be completed concurrently or transferred in from the bachelor's degree program.

- Plan instruction and design learning experiences for all students.
- Assess student learning.
- Develop as a professional educator.

- Demonstrate educational leadership.*

Occupational Information

What can I do with this program?

Candidates who complete the multiple-subject credential program become elementary teachers. The M.A.T. can also qualify candidates for more advanced-level positions within schools.

Additional Education Required?

Holders of CA preliminary teaching credentials are expected to complete a state-approved Teacher Induction to maintain and upgrade their credentials.

The M.A.T. is a terminal degree and does not provide a foundation for further graduate study in a doctoral program.

Public Sector vs. Denominational?

Candidates can find employment in SDA, public, or private schools.

Job Outlook

The job outlook for teachers is excellent as the demand for teachers is expected to increase. The Education Department provides a placement service that assists candidate's entry into the teaching profession. Part of this service includes arranging for interviews with prospective employers during the program.

Scholarships

The Adventist Mission Scholarship in Education is available to incoming freshman and transfer students who commit to earning an SDA teaching credential. A variety of additional scholarships are available to credential candidates during their final quarter of student teaching. Students interested in public school employment may inquire about the Golden State Teacher Grant Program.
