

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN PACIFIC UNION COLLEGE DEGREE COMPLETION PROGRAM (DCP)
AND MENDOCINO COLLEGE
FOR BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION (ECE)

All students who wish to receive a Bachelor of Science in Early Childhood Education (ECE) from Pacific Union College's Degree Completion Program (DCP) must satisfy the requirements in the following three areas:

- ECE Major Coursework (Consists of 60 quarter-units which are earned in the Degree Completion Program)
- ECE Foundational Coursework (Described below- required for admission to program)
- General Education Coursework (Described below)

Finally, students must earn enough additional elective credit to have a total of at least 192 quarter-units of college coursework.

Transfer students with questions are encouraged to contact the DCP office at (707) 965-6505. Transfer students need not fulfill all below requirements before transferring into the DCP program; however, a minimum of 90 quarter-units including the ECE Foundational Coursework should be earned before transferring. All requirements must be completed in order to graduate from Pacific Union College.
