Student Learning Outcomes

Students can:

- Appreciate the diversity of musical styles within and outside the traditional canon of Western music.
- Think, speak, and write clearly and effectively about music.
- Utilize foundational skills in current technology in music notation and synthesis.

Occupational Information

What can I do with this major?

This guide sheet is designed either for the student who wants to obtain a medical or dental surgery degree while pursuing a very strong interest in music, or for the student who cannot make a choice between music and medical/dental surgery at the beginning of college and wants to keep both options as possible career choices. The degree seen in this guide sheet should be considered as a preparation for graduate study, and it is expected that graduates will continue education toward specialized, professional careers in either music or medical/dental surgery.

Additional Education Required?

Most graduates with this degree will need to pursue graduate study in some area before seeking employment. National statistics show that 66% of music students applying to medical schools are accepted, while only 33% of biochemistry majors who apply receive acceptance letters to medical schools.

Job Outlook

Except for unusual cases, employment with only this degree is not to be expected.

How to Construct Your Own Program

1. Counsel with your advisor.
2. Consider your aptitudes, interests, and available courses.
3. Schedule major courses and cognates first.
4. Fill the rest of your schedule with G.E. requirements.
5. For the freshman year include English, Religion, and PE courses. Also include Introductory & Intermediate Algebra unless waived by previous work.

What the Degree Includes

- A total of 192 quarter hours including:
1. A minimum of 60 upper division hours.

 3. Major requirements.
 4. Minimum 2.0 GPA, overall and major.
