Angwin and Napa campuses:

Each academic quarter includes 10 weeks of instruction. One quarter hour normally represents one 50-minute class (1 clock hour) per week throughout an academic quarter. Course credit hours follow a ratio of 1:1 credit to clock hours for theory and 1:3 credit to clock hours for laboratory/clinical time. Variations from these stated ratios are described in the General Catalog; in the BSN nursing major, only one elective mentorship course follows a different credit to clock hour ratio.

Blended Program:

Students attend classes on campus for two core weeks in the quarter. Weeks 1 & 6 to meet face to face with their course faculty. The remainder of the course will follow a synchronous online format. See Table below for more details. Blended Tuition is \$31,101. A typical student in this program receives approximately 50% in institutional and government financial aid, making the cost comparable to the online option.

Online program:

The online program follows the same 11-week quarter system. The same ratios apply in the online program, however because there are 8 weeks of instruction, each quarter hour of credit represents approximately 63 minutes of instructional time per week. Online Tuition is \$385.00 per academic unit (only government aid is available at this cost).

The PUC nursing curriculum includes features designed to strengthen outcomes and encourage students to continue directly from the AS program into the BSN. The curriculum was designed to better allow a student to complete both the AS and the BSN requirements in four years. The PUC nursing programs are designed for students to complete the BSN in a 2-step process, by first completing the prelicensure requirements (the AS degree) and then completing the remaining post licensure requirements (BSN degree). One of the nursing faculty goals (consistent with IOM recommendations to increase the number of baccalaureate-prepared RNs by 2020) has been to increase the number of students continuing on to complete the BSN

requirements by improving the continuity and ease of transition from the AS to the BSN. By allowing students to accomplish the approved classes that are also required for the BSN while working on prelicensure requirements, they are more invested in completing the BSN and are more likely to complete the BSN in one final BSN year. In the time since this curriculum change was implemented in 2010, the BSN enrollment has seen steady increases in enrollment.

There is a trend in some post licensure BSN programs to provide entering students with bulk credit based on completion of licensure or on work experience. Though the faculty have discussed this emerging practice, we have not pursued a change of this sort, and will continue to observe the industry trends.

Prior to implementation, the curriculum was reviewed and approved by the college Curriculum and Efficiency Committee and Academic Senate, and was then submitted to and approved by the California BRN (for the prelicensure AS degree portion of the curriculum) and ACEN (then NLNAC). The college requires 192 hours total and 60 upper-division hours total for baccalaureate degrees. The BSN requirement of 39 upperdivision hours in the major and cognate courses is consistent with other majors offered at the college (range 21-56 upperdivision hours in the major). Complete the BSN in a 2-step process, by first completing the prelicensure requirements (the AS degree) and then completing the remaining post licensure requirements (BSN degree). One of the nursing faculty goals (consistent with IOM recommendations to increase the number of baccalaureate-prepared RNs by 2020) has been to increase the number of students continuing on to complete the BSN requirements by improving the continuity and ease of transition from the AS to the BSN.
