

Receive your BSN in 9-12 months by attending concentrated core week class sessions, with two core week class sessions each quarter, for a total of three quarters.

***Academic Distinctions:***

***Clinical Distinctions:***

- **Scheduling:** Students schedule clinical experiences and participate in mentor selection.
- **Assignments:** Completed independently according to student and mentor schedules.
- **Conferencing:** Conferences are scheduled by the student and may be held by phone/email.

***Admission Pre-requisites:***

- ASN degree with current RN licensure
- Completion of the majority of required General Education courses<sup>1</sup>

***Angwin Core week structure includes a schedule of courses to allow completion of:*<sup>2</sup>**

- Required core BSN courses (43-49 units)
  - Including two practicums:
    - Community Health
    - Health Education / Health Care Management
- Required Religion courses (up to 9 units)

***Financial Information:***

- Cost for 1 year of academic tuition is \$31,101<sup>3</sup> plus fees and textbooks.
- Employer reimbursement and student loans available.

- Winter quarter, October 15
- Spring quarter, January 15
