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➤ **Work Experience**

Students are required to complete a minimum of 80 hours work experience (volunteer/employee) in a physical therapy department, including 20 hours in an inpatient setting and 20 hours in an outpatient setting. Forty hours must be completed prior to receiving an interview.

PLEASE NOTE: C minus (C-) grades are not transferable for credit to Loma Linda University.

**Advanced Human Anatomy (BIOL 422) and Microbiology (MICR 134) are recommended.*

Occupational Information

General Areas of Service

The physical therapist aids in the treatment of disease, injury, or disability by employing physical means (light, heat, cold water, electricity, massage, exercise, and other therapeutic rehabilitative techniques; training in ambulation with braces, crutches and prosthetic devices). Working closely with their patients, the therapist uses psychological and sociological principles to motivate and instruct. Professional opportunities exist in hospitals, physicians' offices, children's centers, athletic training and sports medicine programs, research institutions, rehabilitation centers, outpatient clinics, state and national agencies, private practice, and schools of physical therapy.

Professional training

A graduate degree and successfully passing state board examinations are required to enter the profession.

Job Outlook

Employment opportunities are expected to grow for the foreseeable future.

Earnings

Starting salaries average about \$58,000 a year.
