HOW TO APPLY FOR ADMISSION TO THE TEACHER CREDENTIAL PROGRAM

- Complete one full quarter of college-level coursework.
- Pass EDUC 101 (C- or better) and EDUC 101L (Bor better).
- Obtain and maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.75 (undergraduate) or 3.0 (graduate level).
- Meet the Basic Skills Requirement with passing scores for the CBEST, SAT or ACT, or by meeting the coursework requirement
- Complete a Live Scan and obtain a Certificate of Clearance from the CTC (background check)
- Submit a Complete Application.

FINGERPRINTING and issuance of a
CERTIFICATE of Clearance verifying you
do not have a criminal record are
prerequisites to formal admission to the
Teacher Preparation Program and
participation in field experiences in K-12
classrooms.

Testing Information

RICA - Required of all elementary credential candidates. It demonstrates the candidate's ability to teach reading appropriately at the elementary level. It should be taken during the quarter of student teaching. A preparation session is offered during EDUC 498.

CBEST - The most common option used to meet the Basic Skills requirement. It has three sections: reading, writing, and math.

CSET - Multiple and Single Subject Candidates demonstrate that they are competent to teach in their content area. Candidates should plan to take the CSET during their junior year.

When you pass CBEST, CSET, or RICA you will receive a passing score report from NES via email.

IMMEDIATELY forward this email the Credential Analyst at teachingcredentials@puc.edu so that your passing score can be recorded!

Basic Skills Requirement

Allows the Commission on Teacher Credentialing and Commission-approved preparation programs to verify that a candidate has demonstrated basic skills proficiency by verifying qualifying collegelevel coursework from a regionally accredited institution of higher education

The following conditions must be met:

- 1. The candidate must have earned a grade of "B-" or better.
- 2. The coursework must have been taken at a regionally accredited college or university.
- 3. The coursework must provide three-semester units or equivalent quarter units (4) in Reading, Writing, and Mathematics.
- 4. The coursework must have been taken for academic credit.
- 5. The coursework must be degree applicable.

Subject Matter Competency

Candidate can meet this requirement with one of the follwoing

- 1. Receive a passing score on the applicable CSET examination or completed a Commission-approved subject matter waiver program.
- 2. Successful completion of coursework as verified by a Commission-approved program of professional preparation that addresses each of the Commission-adopted domains of the applicable subject matter requirements
- 3. Successful completion of an academic major in the subject of the credential being sought. Liberal Studies can be used by Multiple Subject credential candidates.
- 4.A combination of coursework and examination options that meet or exceed the domains of the subject matter requirements.
