96 hours distributed as follows:

Domain 1: Religion & Humanities

Minimum, 20 quarter hours distributed as follows:

➤ **Religion**

Take 4 hours of religion courses for each year of attendance at an SDA College: 4-8

➤ **Humanities**

Take the remaining 12-16 hours from at least three of the following areas: 12-16

- Art/Music, Performing Arts (max 4 hours);
- Literature, Philosophy;
- History, Foreign Language.

Work Experience

At least 8 hours of observation experience in Medical Sonography (preferably at LLUMC) is required prior to interview.

Occupational Information

What can I do with this profession?

A sonographer is a highly skilled professional who uses high frequency sound waves (ultrasound) to produce dynamic visual images of the human body.

Students completing the Bachelor of Sciences in Diagnostic Medical Sonography will acquire highly valued skills in the various sonography specialties such as: Obstetrics and Gynecology, Pediatrics, Neurology, Breast, Vascular Structures, and Abdominal Structures.

Professional Training

LLU's 27-month program is 80% face to face coursework with about 20% online. The program is comprised of both classroom and clinical education. It includes rotations to multiple affiliate hospitals for additional clinical training.

Entrance and completion of this program signifies that the candidate is prepared to practice in the sonography profession. Upon completion of this program, students will be prepared and eligible to take the national American Registry of Diagnostic Medical Sonographers (ARDMS) board examinations.

Job Outlook

The medical professions in general are experiencing challenges due to changes in healthcare. LLU students have a very high success rate in obtaining positions before or soon after graduation.

Earnings

Diagnostic Medical Sonographers earn an average of \$64,440 a year or \$30.95 an hour, depending on geographic area, experience and specialty. Those with more on the job experience and higher job positions can earn up to \$88,490 annually.
