

Adventist Mission Scholarship in Education Application 2020-2021

Pacific Union College wants to help support the mission of the Seventh-day Adventist Church by offering a renewable **\$1,000/quarter** or **\$3,000/year** grant to future teachers. This scholarship is renewable on a yearly basis as long as the recipient meets the requirements of the scholarship as determined by the PUC department of education.

Application Deadline: **Before start of your first term at PUC**

Requirements for Initial Award of Scholarship

In order to initially receive the scholarship, applicants must meet the following GPA, degree, and certification program requirements:

1. Degree Requirements (choose one of the following):

- A.S. or B.S. in Early Childhood Education (leading to ECE Permit)
- B.S. Liberal Studies + Elementary Credential Program (leading to elementary credential)
- Content Area Degree + Secondary Credential Program (leading to secondary credential) (appropriate degrees include Art, English Education, Mathematics, Music Education, PE Education, Science-Biology/Chemistry/Physics, Religion, Social Studies, Spanish)

2. GPA requirements at time of initial application

- a) Incoming freshmen: No incoming GPA requirement, but must hold a GPA of at least 2.5 at end of first year and 2.75 by end of second year to renew scholarship.
- b) Transfer students: Must initially hold and maintain a cumulative GPA of at least 2.75.
- c) PUC sophomores, juniors, seniors, and post-baccalaureate 5th year applicants: Must initially hold and maintain a cumulative GPA of at least 2.75.
- d) Post-baccalaureate M.A.T. candidates: Must initially hold and maintain a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0.

3. Recipients of the scholarship must meet with the Credential Analyst during the first quarter of the scholarship to finalize the scholarship. Failure to do so will result in cancellation of the scholarship. When the scholarship has been approved, the recipient will receive a letter from the Credential Office with additional information regarding maintaining the scholarship.
