

## Course Requirements

96 hours distributed as follows:

Minimum 20 quarter hours, distributed as follows:

#### > Religion

Take 4 hours of religion courses for each year of attendance at an SDA College: 4-8

#### > Humanities

Take the remaining 12-16 hours from at least three of the following areas: History/Civilization, Fine Arts (theory course work), Performing Arts/Visual Arts (not to exceed 4 quarter hours), Literature, Foreign Language, and Philosophy/Ethics.

## Occupational Information

### General Areas of Service

Dental Hygienists may work as independent contractors, in dental offices, in school systems, for health-related or governmental agencies, or may teach in a Dental Hygiene program.

### Professional Training

To be licensed one must graduate from an accredited Dental Hygiene program and pass both a written and clinical examination. The B.S. degree is required to do research, teach, or work in public or school health programs.

There are increasing openings here and abroad.

### Job Outlook

Employment opportunities are expected to continue to grow 19% from 2014 to 2024 (www.bls.gov).

### Admission Information

For entrance to the junior professional year at Loma Linda University, the applicant must have the following:

- 96 quarter hours of acceptable college credit (grades of C or higher).
- Excellent academic standing.. The entering average GPA for 2014 was 3.2 and average science GPA was 2.9.
- Minimum of 20 hours of shadowing.
- Acceptable personal qualities.
- A formal interview (by invitation only).
- Three letters of referencing including: spiritual leader, employer, and science professor. *A PUC Preprofessional Recommendation Committee letter is preferred in place of the science professor letter. Talk to your advisor for more information about the committee letter.*
- The subject requirements outlined on the other side of this sheet.

#### Application

The applicant should apply between August and early December for best chances. The application is made through the ADEA Dental Hygiene Centralized Application Service (DHCAS). Apply at <http://www.adea.org/dhcas.aspx>.

At the time of application request a PUC Preprofessional Recommendation Committee letter at the Office of the Academic Dean.

*The Dental Hygiene program begins in mid September.*
